VA expands Patient-Centered Community Care (PC3) Contracts to Provide Access to Primary Care

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced on August 13, 2014 that primary care has been added to the services available to Veterans through VA Patient-Centered Community Care (PC3) contracts, a key and evolving part of the non-VA medical care program. Eligible Veterans are already able to access inpatient specialty care. Outpatient specialty care, mental health care, limited emergency care and limited newborn care for female Veterans following childbirth under PC3.





Veteran Aid and Attendance Benefit



One in three seniors in this country are Veterans' or surviving spouse of a Veteran. These heroes are our fathers, mothers, spouses, and friends, and may be eligible for this unique benefit through the Veterans Administration. Millions of qualifying Veterans go without this benefit simply because of a lack of information, or lack of help. This benefit provides funding to help keep the Veteran and his or her spouse, and surviving spouse of the Veteran safe and comfortable with in-home care services be able to age gracefully in their home.

The Veterans Aid and Attendance Pension Benefit, is a non-service connected pension benefit. It is an earned cash benefit that reimburses Veterans for in-home care services.

Veterans who served a minimum of 90 days of active duty, including one day of active duty during a period of war such as World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War, and have an honorable discharge may be eligible for this benefit.

The Veterans Aid and Attendance Pension Benefit, is a non-service connected pension benefit. It is an earned cash benefit that reimburses Veterans for in-home care services.

The in-home senior care services for Veterans that can be reimbursed include activities of daily livings, which include activities such as bathing, dressing, cooking, medication management, light housekeeping and transportation. In-home senior care helps Veterans, their spouses, or surviving spouses of Veterans get around and enjoy their senior years safely, while being able to remain in their home.

In addition, in-home senior care services can also help Veterans, their spouses', or surviving spouses' of Veterans who have been diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease, or Dementia may also be eligible for the reimbursement. For these individuals the right care and comfort is extremely important such as remaining in home and being in familiar surroundings.

"CAUTION: Objects in your calendar are much closer than they appear."

Qualifying for benefits for the Improved Pension (a.k.a. "Aid and Attendance") is hard work, with some of the qualifications being tricky. This is particularly true for the asset test in order to qualify.

Additionally, it's extremely important to be sure you don't do anything that will help qualify you for Improved Pension that will later disqualify you for Medicaid. This can be a real problem when you are moving assets to qualify for VA and then get stuck in a five-year look back for Medicaid. This can happen when you transfer assets for less than value to qualify for the VA benefit.

That's one of the reasons that a Special Needs Trust can be extremely helpful.

At the present time the VA has no penalty for transferring assets. So, you'd think that it's okay to just send the disqualifying portion of your assets to the children? That works for VA, but you'll run into a few problems - and not just from Medicaid if that becomes a necessity in the future.

For example, giving your children assets might cause you real financial distress. A simple gift, with no strings means there is no obligation of your children to help support you. Plus, if the children get into financial difficulty, law suits, etc., creditors can seek to attach those funds.

An Irrevocable Special Needs Trust will do the following:

1. Remove assets from the VA claimant's name, thus helping to pass the asset test;
2. Since these are irrevocable trust assets, the trustee has no ownership, which means that creditors of the trustee have no claim on the assets;
3. Plus, the terms of the trust will restrict the trustee from using the funds for any but the specific purposes for the "special needs" of the claimant/grantor of the trust;
4. Finally, if Medicaid looms into the picture and the transfer of assets occurred less than five years previously, the remaining trust assets can be returned to the claimant/grantor, for the claimant to do whatever is required under the Medicaid rules in order to qualify at that time.

Notwithstanding the fact that this is an "irrevocable" trust, the trustee has full power to provide for the claimant/grantor's special needs as the trustee sees fit in trustee's absolute discretion, including returning the assets to the claimant/grantor to qualify for Medicaid.

Qualifying for government benefits is complicated. It can get even trickier when you have to keep one eye into the future to make sure that you don't close doors to options if the future require a change of plans. The most drastic AND most likely - is going from VA Pension to Medicaid to help pay for Long Term Care.

Habitat for Humanity—Deconstruction

Habitat for Humanity is an organization whose vision is “A world where everyone has a decent place to live.” They build and repair houses all over the world using donations and volunteer labor. By moving families out of sub-standard living conditions and into their own home, stability is created for the family that significantly changes their lives.

ReStores support Habitat for Humanity’s mission by selling new and used donated items, including furniture, appliances, building materials and home accessories. Proceeds from the ReStore helps build more houses in the local community. What most people don’t realize are the ways the ReStores help the local community.

ReStores contribute 100% of the profit generated through store sales toward the construction and renovation of homes right here in our backyard. Last year, two local stores raised enough money to build 6 homes within our commu-

nity. Vacant lots and abandoned or blighted homes once a maintenance burden on our cities, are back on the tax rolls and contributing to our local economy.

Another interesting way ReStores help the local community is by diverting reusable materials back into the supply chain. In 2014, the two stores in our area alone diverted 868 tons of furniture, appliances, building materials and other reusable items on their way to a landfill.

While most of the items are donated by people who are replacing, upgrading, cleaning out or downsizing, perhaps their best kept secret is the Deconstruction Program. The program is designed to do two things; bring valuable donations into the ReStores, and help individuals and business save money on expensive remodeling or renovation projects. Focusing on reducing landfill waste and recycling usable materials, Habitat for Humanity in Seminole-Apopka

offers a Deconstruction team who will come to you to discuss your remodeling or renovation project at your home or business. They will determine what can be reused and sold in one of their ReStore locations. And, It gets even better. Their team will then come out and remove those items for you, free of charge. This can include cabinets, doors, appliances, toilets, sinks, tubs, furniture, fixtures and more. You save on the cost of paying your contractor to remove those items and the dumpster or disposal fees. Habitat for Humanity is fully insured and provides a tax receipt for the donation.

The results; reduced landfill waste, money saved by homeowners and income generated supporting a non-profit that changes lives and the community. Everyone wins!

VA Update—Ted Costello

For those that did not get the message; The Baldwin Park VA Clinic will remain open and the medical facilities will continue to be used to serve our veterans. We have 2,600 veterans visiting that clinic every day. The number is rising. The long-awaited Orlando VA Medical Center in Lake Nona is expected to start seeing patients in the summer of 2015. VA officials considered closing the Baldwin Park clinic and transitioning its outpatient medical services to Lake Nona. That would have meant a long drive for many veterans. However, a VA analysis found that the medical needs of the veteran population were growing and that the "current workload already exceeds the projected workload that was projected for 2023.
