## Membership & Recruiting Update

Not only are we in a new membership year, but the rules have changed.

Now, for the first time ever, we can accept ANY veteran who had served honorably since December 7, 1941. Those veterans who were not eligible due to his or her dates of service are no longer excluded from Legion membership. So, if you know of a friend or neighbor who is a veteran, ask them to join. We are stronger in numbers even if they "don't have time" to participate.

This year, 2019-2020, the Post needs the 140 members to renew in order to attain 100%. So far, our "Paid up for Life" (PUFL), Active Duty members, and our Honorary members make the numbers look good for a start. And, the 93 members who have already paid either online or by mail bring us to 66.42% as of 16 OCT 2019. We are hoping to have our 100% membership before 31 DEC 2019.

By the way, the Son's Squadron is at 12 of their 26 members for a 46.15% renewal. And the Auxilia-ry is at 18 of their goal of 22 or 82%.



In October we received notification that the Department of Florida Auxiliary, in conjunction with The American Legion will be collecting new items for our homeless female Veterans at the Fall Conference in early November. Park Legion family, but also to the membership in Oviedo Post 243. Through the efforts of our Post, our S.A.L. Squadron, Post 243, and our own members, we have received \$1000 in donations that we will use to purchase items for this project. ## Notes from Our Service Officer

### Proposed Changes to Eligibility Criteria for Burial at Arlington National Cemetery

Acting Secretary of the Army Ryan D. McCarthy has recently announced proposed changes to eligibility criteria for burial at Arlington National Cemetery (ANC) that will include military retirees for above-ground inurnment. The FY2019 National Defense Authorization Act directed the Secretary of the Army to establish revised eligibility criteria to keep the cemetery functioning as an active burial ground "well into the future" - defined as 150 years. The Army will now begin the federal government's public rulemaking process, which includes soliciting public feedback to the proposed changes. "Arlington National Cemetery is a national shrine for all Americans, but especially those who have served our great nation," said McCarthy. "We must ensure it can honor those we have lost for many years to come." In addition to directing ANC to preserve 1,000 gravesites for current and future Medal of Honor recipients, the Acting Secretary proposed revised eligibility criteria for those who honorably served our nation, as broadly outlined below:

#### For below-ground interment:

- Killed in Action, to include repatriated remains of service members;
- Recipients of the Silver Star and above who also served in combat;
- Recipients of the Purple Heart;
- Combat-related service deaths while conducting uniquely military activities;
- Former Prisoners of War;
- Presidents and Vice Presidents of the United States; and

Veterans with combat service who also served out of uniform as a government official and made significant contributions to the nation's security at the highest levels of public service.

#### For above-ground inurnment:

- World War II-era veterans, to include legis-

lated active duty designees;

- Retirees from the armed forces who are eligible to receive retired pay but are not otherwise eligible for interment;
- Veterans who have served a minimum of two years on active duty and who have served in combat; and

Veterans without combat service who also served out of uniform as a government official and made significant contributions to the nation's security at the highest levels of public service.

Additionally, the proposed revisions at ANC will not affect veterans' burial benefits or veteran eligibility at the Department of Veterans Affairs national cemeteries and state veterans' cemeteries. The next step to implement the proposed rule is notice and public comment in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act. The ANC expects the clearance process to take a minimum of nine months to make public in the Federal Register for citizens to comment.

**VA, Partners Offer Flu Shot:** Veterans enrolled in VA and in need of a flu shot can receive it for free at their nearest VA health care facility or at their local [Walgreens](#). The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, VA, and doctors suggest all individuals get their flu shot during the fall. This is particularly true for individuals over the age of 65, pregnant women, caregivers of infants or family members with health problems, health care employees, and people with heart problems and other chronic illnesses or conditions.

**MIA Update:** The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced six new identifications of missing and unaccounted-for from WWII and the Korean War. Four Marine Corps Veterans and Two Army Veterans.

#### VA Disability Ratings

Certain VA disability benefits are considered Protected Ratings, according to the VA. This is where it helps to be able to find and read the appropriate regulations or find an expert who can help you through the task. Protection is covered Under 38 CFR 3.951 and 38 CFR 3.952. The present rules are:

□ **5-year rule:** If the rating has been in effect for 5 years, it cannot be reduced unless your

condition has improved on a sustained basis (The VA must have documentation supporting this is a permanent improvement). □ **10-year rule:** A service-connected disability rating cannot be terminated if it has been in effect for 10 years. Compensation can be reduced if evidence exists that the condition has improved. The sole exception is if the VA can prove fraud, in which case the VA can terminate the benefits. □ **20-year rule:** If the rating has been in effect for 20 years, it cannot be reduced below the

lowest rating it has held for the previous 20 years. The only exception is if the VA can prove fraud. Measure the 20-year period of 38 CFR 3.951(b) from the earliest effective date of the combined or individual evaluations. □ **100% rule:** The VA must prove your medical situation has materially improved and as a result, you are able to perform substantial work.
