Renew On-line for Faster Service!

Members of the Legion and S A L can renew their membership online and print their new card at the same time. National has just completed the modifications to allow the Sons members to renew online. All the member needs to do is logon to <https://mylegion.org>. If you don't have a logon, you can register right there. There is ONE CAUTION in registering. Your email address on file with National must be the one that you use to register. If you are receiving emails from National, that email address is the one on file. If the email has changed or is not correct, contact the Adjutant to get it corrected before you try to register. If you do not have access to a computer, we will continue as before.

If you have renewed ONLINE for 2023, and DID NOT print your card, let the Adjutant know and he can send you the printed card. Between 25 and 45 percent of the members are renewing online, which is great.

Notes from Our Service Officer

H.R. 232, the Real Justice for Our Veterans Act, would authorize the Department of Justice (DOJ) to provide grants to local governments for improving retention rates in veterans' treatment courts and specialized programs that integrate substance use treatment services with criminal justice proceedings. The bill also would allow veterans to participate in a regular drug court program if no veterans' treatment court is available.

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has reported a surge in disability claims (17 percent) since the enactment of the comprehensive Veterans toxic exposure act (PACT Act). The surge in claims was not unexpected and the FY2023 VA budget approved by Congress included both funding and flexibility for increased staffing at VA medical centers to counter a possible increase in enrollment. The VA has a goal of about 52,000 new hires this fiscal year to replace departing staffers and add personnel to high-demand areas.

PACT Act Fraud Prevention:

To avoid being a victim of these schemes, here are some helpful tips to remember:

- Apply directly to VA
- Be cautious of aggressive law firms or compa-

nies.

- Be cautious of for-profit companies that use VA's name.
- Review all legally binding documents thoroughly.
- Be wary of media advertisements regarding legal representation for presumptive VA claims.
- Veterans and survivors who think they might be eligible should apply for PACT Act benefits right now. Go to va.gov/PACT or call 1-800-MYVA411 for more information.

The Pentagon has indicated it has begun its review of military pay and benefits known as the Quadrennial Review of Military Compensation (QRMC) to make certain service members are being paid fairly and can afford basic needs such as food and housing.

The QRMC is conducted every four years to examine whether military pay, and other benefits are suitable.

The Defense **POW/MIA** Accounting Agency announced two burial updates and two new identifications for service members who have been missing and unaccounted-for from World War II and Korea. USS Oklahoma (2), Army Air Force (2).
