

Notes from Our Service Officer

VA has released a Redesigned Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry, called AHOBPR 2.0, to better identify and investigate adverse health conditions typically attributed to airborne hazards and burn pits exposure. New features include broader participation criteria, clear opt-out procedures, and automatic registration based on DOD records. While enrollment in AHOBPR 2.0 does not influence a veteran's health care or benefits, the data collected will help VA develop more advanced treatments, use more precise predictive medicine, make better informed decisions pertaining to presumptive conditions, and deliver targeted care. Read proactive and preventive and toxic expomore about the registry sures. Locate an accredited representative for help filing a related claim.

PACT Act is Two Years Old!

The Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxins (PACT) Act is now two years old. This law has been the most significant expansion of benefits and health care for toxic exposed veterans and their survivors in over thirty years.

To reach this milestone, VA has processed more than 2 million claims in 2024 – another <u>all-time record</u>, on pace to surpass last year's record by more than 27%. VA encourages all Veterans, family members, caregivers, and survivors to <u>learn more about VA</u> and apply for their world-class <u>health care</u> and <u>earned benefits</u> today.

VetSuccess on Campus (VSOC) supports Veterans and service members who are transitioning from the military to college life and certain qualified dependents. VSOC counselors are available at 104 college campuses across the country to provide benefits assistance and counseling to help you prepare for viable careers.

Sign in to view your VA disability rating Sign in with your existing Login.gov, ID.me, DS Logon, or **My** HealtheVet account. If you don't have any of these accounts, you can create free Login.gov or ID.me account now.


