Notes from Our Service Officer

Reminder for VA Secure Sign In:

Reminder for VA Secure Sign In: VA has issued changes for signing into your VA.gov or My HealtheVet accounts. Currently, there are four ways to sign in to your VA accounts: LOG-IN.GOV, ID.ME, My HealtheVet, and DS Logon. Both My HealtheVet and DS Logon will be discontinued for accessing VA accounts. My HealtheVet sign in will be available until Jan. 31, 2025. Veterans, family members, caregivers, and survivors with VA accounts are encouraged to transition how they sign in to access these accounts prior to that date.

+ You'll have 2 sign-in account options that meet modern security standards: a **Login.gov** or **ID.me** account.

+ New Deadlines

The deadline to stop using **My HealtheVet** for VA.gov and other online VA services has been **extended to March 4, 2025**. After that, you'll need to use **Login.gov** or **ID.me** to sign in.

The deadline to switch from DS Logon to ID.me or Login.gov is still September 30, 2025.

TRICARE Pharmacy Network Expands With Kroger Pharmacies:

Good News! If you use TRICARE for your prescriptions, there are now more pharmacy options available to you. As of February 5, 2025, the Kroger Family of Pharmacies has rejoined the TRICARE Pharmacy Program. This means that over 2,200 new pharmacies are now part of the network across 35 states!

Doug Collins Becomes New VA Secretary

On February 4, 2025, the U.S. Senate confirmed Doug Collins as the new Secretary of Veterans Affairs. Collins is the first post-9/11 veteran to lead the VA. His background as a former Republican congressman from Georgia and an Air Force Reserve Colonel gives him both military and government experience. He also served as a military Chaplain, helping service members during difficult times.

The Defense **POW/MIA Accounting Agency** announced 4 identifications and 3 burial updates for service members who have been missing and unaccounted for from World War II and the Korean War.

School Medals — Bob Colbert

School medals are presented in May (end of the school year) and the Winter Park Post presents medals at several schools. One challenge that we are often faced with is the lack of "presenters" for these medals. In some extreme cases, the schools have presented them for us, but that is not the same as having someone from the Post present the medals to the deserving students. Our presence helps to emphasize Americanism in addition to promoting the American Legion family.

I won't have the actual dates until early to mid April, but we are asking the schools to send us there two nominees so that the certificates can be prepared. The presentations are usually made at about 9 AM at each school and they usually will put us at the beginning of their program so we can leave right after our presentation. On some days we may have a second school at which to present so including travel time, if we have a second school, we are done

by or before 11 AM. It really means a lot to the students, their parents, and the school's faculty to have a Legionnaire in their Legion cap present those medals.

Another challenge is that both Seminole and Orange County elementary schools present on the last few days of the school year. With eight elementary schools to cover, it can present a coverage issue. Our Auxiliary Unit also presents their Scholastic Achievement medals at these same schools and they, too, have only a few volunteers available to cover multiple schools. We work as a team with the Auxiliary to be sure each school is covered.

One of the boy's Eagle Projects is building a Flag Retirement area beside the Post where we can respectfully retire used and damaged American Flags. There is a specific process in retiring the American Flag with respect and once this area is completed, the Post and Scout Troops will be able to do it. Currently, we are temporarily taking the American Flags that are dropped off at the Post to another service organization for their disposal. Once this area is completed, we will post pictures in a future newsletter for all to see.

One of the girls has recently completed her Eagle Project where her team of volunteers replaced the worn-out benches at the Audubon Society. They did the actual construction of the benches here at the Post. Pictures of this project were in the November/December newsletter.

So, you can see, the Scouting movement is alive and well and growing here at the Post.

Boys State — Bob Colbert

Boys State 2025 is just a few months away. The Post will have screened eight candidates to fill the four delegate slots and three alternate slots. The actual selection was made on February 22nd which is after our newsletter deadline. We will have the results of the selection process in the next newsletter.

At the selection meeting, each delegate and alternate will be given a packet explaining what they must do to complete their application. This must be completed by March 19th. When this is done, the boys move on.

Their next step is to participate in the Boys State Orientation session where the details of how things work will be explained as well as giving the actual departure and return times for the trip.

Finally, they board the bus and go to Tallahassee.

The four delegates will become part of the fictitious state in Tallahassee for a week. The youth will be using the actual chambers of the legislature and other government facilities. Each candidate is asked to prepare a "bill" that he would like to see implemented and during the week, he will be able to "lobby" for his bill to try to get it passed by the legislature and signed off by the governor.

The three alternates will probably go to Boys State in place of a delegate or fill a vacancy for another Post who was not able to procure a delegate. In years past, we have seen all of our alternates go to Boys State.

We ask the delegates and, if possible, the alternates to return to the Post for our August meeting to give us a report on their experiences. The delegates that attended Girls State will also make a presentation. THE AMERICAN LEGION


