Eligibility

The American Legion is the nation's largest, most influential, effective and dependable advocate of veteran affairs. Since 1919, Legionnaires have fought for the rights of servicemen and women. Today we stand 2.7 million members Nationwide, and have over 130,000 Legionnaires from The Department of Florida.

If you have served honorably during any eligible war eras or are on active duty today, serving honorably, become a member of Winter Park Memorial Post 112, The American Legion, Department of Florida!

Eligibility Information

If you have served federal active duty in the United States Armed Forces since December 7, 1941, and have been honorably discharged or are still serving – you are eligible for membership in The American Legion!

*Because eligibility dates remain open, all active duty members of the U.S. Armed Forces are eligible to join The American Legion at this time, until the date of the end of hostilities as determined by the government of the United States.

**U.S. Merchant Marine eligible only from December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946 (WWII).

We're veterans just like you who care about America, veterans and their families and our nation's youth. The Legion is a powerful voice in Washington dedicated to preserving the rights we've all earned – and were promised – by our service to the nation we love.

As we come to a close of our 2025-2026 program year, our Unit has a lot to be proud of as we accomplished more this year than ever before.

- Our Unit grew to 35 members and more than met our 100% membership goal.

- We applied for, and received, a \$2500 grant from the American Legion Auxiliary National Foundation to support the Central Florida Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America in their Creative Arts programs.
- We applied for, and received, a \$1000 grant from the Orange County East Rotary Foundation to support our Girls State program and our school medals program.
- Members enjoyed meeting the National Legion Commander when he visited Post 112 in January.
- We provided birthday cakes for our Post's meetings every month in which the birthday of a military branch falls.
- We supported the Post's Legion Birthday open house by bringing 3 dozen donuts for breakfast.
- We assisted the Post 112 Giving Tree efforts by helping with the shopping for their Veteran families.
- We donated three \$100 holiday food and staples boxes

for the Lake Baldwin Giving Tree program families for their Christmas dinner .

- The Eastbrook Elementary backpack program received all the non-perishable food items for 15 families in need for a complete Thanksgiving dinner.
- We manned an information table at Eastbrook's Veteran's Day breakfast and program where we answered questions about the Legion family as well as giving each Veteran who attended a Poppy and a small American flag as a thank you for their service.
- We established a new "Tushies and Toes" program this year that provided socks and underwear for the clinic at Eastbrook for students in need. We plan to do this program again in the fall.
- We purchased wreaths for the Wreaths Across America celebration at Pineywood Cemetery in December and members participated in laying wreaths on Veteran graves after the program.
- We interviewed seven outstanding young ladies for Girls State so we could send two delegates and two alternates to Tallahassee this summer.
- We distributed Poppies for Veterans Day and are hoping to have a booth for Memorial Day.
- We asked five elementary schools to submit Americanism essays for the National

Essay contest. We judged the essays received during our February meeting and sent our winner to Department for the state contest. The winning student will receive an Americanism Essay medal and certificate during the school's 5th grade graduation program in late May.

- We will be presenting Scholastic Achievement medals and certificates to two outstanding students at Brookshire, Dommerich, Eastbrook, Lakemont, and Rainbow Elementary Schools at the end of May.
- We have been well represented at all four 6th District meetings held this year as well as having members attend the Department's Workshop, Fall Conference, and Annual Convention.

Notes from Our Service Officer

Disability Benefits Questionnaire (DBQ) scams continue to target veterans seeking disability compensation. While DBQs allow submission of private medical evidence, some companies charge high fees and falsely promise favorable outcomes. Free compensation and pension exams are provided when needed through VA or contracted providers. To avoid fraud, veterans should verify exam requests directly with VA and avoid paying for questionable services. Trusted, accredited representatives can help navigate the claims process safely. The American Legion, Disabled Veterans, VFW and others offer free, accredited assistance to file and manage claims. Only use an accredited representative.

Transportation Service, VetRide and partnerships coordinated through VA medical facilities. These programs are designed to reduce missed appointments and improve access to care for veterans who face transportation challenges due to age, disability, distance, or limited local transit options. Transportation assistance is available for eligible veterans traveling to VA health care appointments, including pri-

mary care, specialty visits, and approved community care. Veterans can access these services by contacting their local VA medical center or VA transportation office. Transportation may be provided through volunteer drivers, contracted services, or rideshare.

Currently, in limited situations, VA may pay a portion of a beneficiary's monetary benefits directly to the beneficiary's dependent, referred to as an apportionment. VA has implemented a new ruling that will limit the circumstances in which compensation, pension, and dependency and indemnity compensation (DIC) benefits are apportioned and will stop making need-based apportionments going forward. This change serves to avoid conflicts with awards granted by state family courts. State family courts are usually more familiar with family circumstances and therefore better suited to make decisions regarding financial matters. An apportionment is when VA pays a portion of monetary benefits directly to dependents, rather than to the Veteran or beneficiary.

The Defense **POW/MIA** Accounting Agency announced no new identifications or burial updates.

Commander Jim Middlekauff presented the UCF Army ROTC medals, and Bob Colbert presented the Lake Howell High School NJROTC medals.
