Here we are starting a new year. Don't get upset, but you will be seeing the reminders from National about the 2027 Dues starting very soon. This is to get all members paid by December 31, 2026. Technically, your membership runs the calendar year. You get an extra six months of membership as a new member if you join in July of the year before. The Legion does not have a way of "pro-rating" membership, so whenever you pay for your membership, it expires on DEC 31 of the year that is printed on the card. Our voting strength (number of member votes at Convention) is based on our membership as of 30 April, so there is a reason to pay "early" and if we had a bar or lounge, only members with a current year membership card would be allowed to enter.

If you have not created an ID on the National WEB site – <https://MyLegion.org> - You are missing out of some key features. Aside from the fact that you can check, update or add to your personal information, you can also pay your dues, not just this year but for up to three years! This means that, if the dues go up for any reason, it will not affect the years that you have already paid. The Post is notified of your payment, generally within 48 hours. If you have a "log in" you can print your new membership card immediately. Regardless, we will send you the card as well and an informational update about the goings on around the Post. AND you save the postage and "wait time" for the mail to arrive. You do not have to create an account on MyLegion.org if you only want to pay your dues. There is a button on the screen to "Renew Now."

As of 8/17/2026 we are at 50% for the 2026/2027 year. I wish to thank our exec committee for making membership an agenda item at the last meeting. We need change to entice our younger veterans and their families to carry on this organization and the programs that they support. We have one of the best assets "Our Post Home" for families to enjoy. Thanks

Star Act Stalls Over Funding Fight

The Major Richard Star Act carries 315 House cosponsors on H.R. 2102 and 77 Senate cosponsors on S. 1032, and it still has not reached the President's desk. The bill would end the dollar-for-dollar offset that reduces military retired pay for Chapter 61 medical retirees who also receive VA disability compensation. The Congressional Budget Office estimates that for the nearly 59,000 medically retired veterans receiving Combat-Related Special Compensation, the change would raise total compensation by an average of roughly \$1,450 per month.

The obstacle is the pay-for. CBO scores the Star Act at approximately \$78 billion in direct spending over the 2026 through 2036 period, and congressional PAYGO rules require that cost to be offset. The vehicle chosen for it, the Take Care of America's Veterans Act (H.R. 9237 and S. 4744), bundles more than 60 veterans bills and funds the Star Act in part by revising the VA rating schedule: tinnitus would lose its standalone compensable rating except when tied to otherwise non-compensable hearing loss, and obstructive sleep apnea controlled by treatment would drop to a 0 to 10 percent rating. VA projects those changes would reduce

disability compensation by up to \$57 billion over ten years and affect as many as 1.5 million veterans. Current ratings would not be reduced; the changes apply to new claims and future reassessments. On July 16 the House rejected a motion to recommit that would have swapped the rating offsets for unobligated Department of War funds, failing 210 to 211 with three Republicans joining every voting Democrat, and leadership then pulled the bill before final passage.

VA Secures Record Drug Price Reductions

The Department of Veterans Affairs announced on August 13 that it has secured a record \$10.44 billion in pharmaceutical price reductions so far in Fiscal Year 2026. The figure compares with \$5.23 billion in FY2024 and \$7.99 billion in FY2025, and reflects negotiated pricing on drugs purchased for the Veterans Health Administration rather than a discretionary savings account.

White House Announces Creation of Military Spouse Commission: President Donald Trump has signed an executive order establishing the President's Military Spouse Commission to advise and assist on policies that affect military spouses and families.

Voting is part of the Americanism Program. The American Legion encourages all Americans to register and to vote in all elections. We are now in an election cycle to elect public officials whose decisions directly influence the lives and well-being of all citizens. Please exercise your right as a citizen and get out and vote.

Another part of Americanism is Patriotism and respect for our Flag. According to the Flag Code when a flag passes by in a parade:

- Removing Hats: All non-religious and non-uniformed headwear should be taken off with your right hand and held at your left shoulder, the hand being over the heart.
- The Hand Salute: Civilians should place their right hand over their heart.
- Uniformed Personnel: Veterans and active-duty military personnel are encouraged to render the military salute instead of removing their hats.
- Duration: You should stand at attention facing the flag until it has completely passed you.
